CONTENT

The course covers the psychological foundations of human interaction, focusing on core social motives and communication behavior across cultures. Students examine the relationship between culture, identity, self-presentation, and social roles in multicultural settings. The program introduces the dramaturgy of communication, including situations, roles, and interaction scripts. Practical activities include role plays, simulations, and case studies that support experiential learning. Studio-based video recordings and their analysis help students reflect on their own communication styles. The course integrates theory and practice to strengthen intercultural competence and communicative effectiveness.
